


"A Sanctuary in the City... Living Faith"

It was amazing to listen to people who had suffered, not only black people, you know—white people, too.... We've always got to be recognizing that despite the aberrations, the fundamental thing about humanity, about people, is that they are good, they were made good and really want to be good."

## ADULT FAITH FORMATION

#### WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Thursdays at 9:30 for coffee and fellowship; study begins with prayer at 9:45— Room #306 Join Pastor Chrissy for a study on the Fruits of the Spirit, inspired by *Tending the Wild Garden* by Eugenia Anne Gamble. In a world focused on appearances, this book invites us to cultivate a deeper relationship with the Spirit, where love, joy, peace, and other virtues grow naturally. Gamble offers a vision of spiritual growth rooted in God's nurturing presence, rather than a checklist of traits. Through reflection and guidance, we learn to tend the soil of our souls so the Spirit's fruit can flourish. The book is optional and available online or at local bookstores.

#### NOODLING AT NOON

We will begin to Noodle again together on September 9. We will center conversation in Bill McKibben's book, *The Flag, the Cross, and the Station Wagon*. In this revelatory cry of the heart, McKibben digs deep into our history (and his own well-meaning but not all-seeing past)--race and inequality in America, the rise of the religious right, and our environmental crisis. He finds that he is not without hope. And he ponders what from our past could, or should, be reclaimed in the fight for a fairer future.
