

‡MUSIC MINUTE: Throughout February, Black History Month, we will highlight African American musical voices. Langston Hughes (1901-1967) was an influential American poet and leader of the Harlem Renaissance. He wrote nonfiction as well as fiction, poetry, drama, and contributed lyrics to several musicals. Composer H. Leslie Adams (1932-2024) is most known for his voice works, especially the cycle *Nightsongs*, from which today's Offertory Anthem is taken. Adams beautifully illustrates Hughes's text with simple, chordal accompaniment, leaving the voice exposed but well supported.

Each day, our neighbors reach out to us in need of a little help. Many are housing insecure or seeking stable housing, desperately trying to keep the heat on or struggling with mounting medical bills. The Pastor's Discretionary Fund here at FPC exists to help meet those needs, in collaboration with other community agencies and churches.

In 2025, the fund helped dozens of individuals and families with around \$6000 total in rent and utility assistance. The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is funded by our Christmas Eve offerings and other contributions. 2026 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Several endowments have been established at First Presbyterian Church with portions of these endowments designated to be used for scholarships. Scholarships are awarded for one year and a scholarship recipient may reapply for consideration in subsequent years.

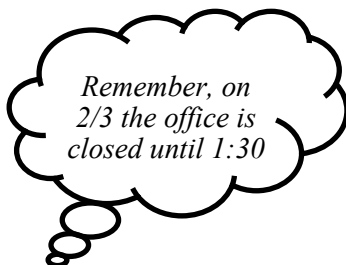
