‡Music Minute: Richard Proulx (1937-2010) was an American composer of church music. His body of work includes over 300 pieces written for choir, handbells, and organ, as well as a number of hymns. This fantasy on a familiar tune is written for an uncommon pairing of instruments: saxophone and organ. It contains two distinct sections, the first free-form and nebulous, followed by a sustained dialogue. Veni Creator Spiritus (Come, Creator Spirit) is a medieval hymn, still often sung on Pentecost and other occasions as an invocation of the Holy Spirit.
